## Background:

As per the report to Council on August 12, 2020, a survey was posted on the Township website in order to receive feedback from residents on the animal services review. The anticipated steps for this project were established as shown below:

1. Staff Research
2. Phase 1 of Public Engagement - Survey
3. Draft Responsible Pet Ownership By-law
4. Phase 2 of Public Engagement to seek input on draft by-law
5. Present Responsible pet Ownership By-law

This project is intended to, upon final delivery and approval, replace the current Dog Licensing and Control By-law and the Cat limit By-law. The intention is to develop a Responsible Pet Ownership Program that focuses on providing guidelines and requirements that will help ensure the health and safety of residents and animals in the Township.

## Discussion:

The survey was open from September 15 until October 6 on the Township website. The link to the survey was shared on social media, electronic newsletter and in the Seaway News. The survey was only available to Township residents. In order to prevent non-resident responses, the Township included the following steps:

- Responses were limited to 1 per IP address.
- Respondents had to confirm they were a Township resident. If they indicated they were not a resident, they could not complete the survey.
- Respondents who said they were residents, had to enter a valid South Stormont postal code.

The survey received 504 responses. Staff will prepare a series of reports presenting results from the survey along with a summary of staff research and preliminary recommendations.

Staff has also received feedback from residents aside from the survey. This includes the requests to prohibit the feeding of stray/feral cats. It's important to note, that these complaints have also been forwarded to the OPP and they have advised that property owners noticing someone trespassing on their property to feed cats should contact the OPP. We also received the request to allow the feeding of stray/feral cats.

- Prohibit the feeding of stray cats.
