# Recent Accomplishments

#### Fire Department

- Implementation of ICO Solutions for HR, Inventory, Prevention and Incident Reports
- ► Kitchen renovation at Station 1 in Long Sault
- Responded to 200 incidents in 2020 (250 in 2019)
- New Pump for Station 2 to be delivered in the Spring
- Tanker Shuttle Accreditation
- Enbridge Inc. grant of \$7,500
- ▶ 117 courses were completed in FireRescue Academy
- Received snowmobile and rescue basket donation
- Reviewed and updated 40 operational procedures







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# Recent Accomplishments

#### **By-law Enforcement**

- Closed 246 cases in AccessE11
- Responsible Pet Ownership by-law Draft
- DocuPet New Dog Licensing Program

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# Proposed Operations Budget Highlights

- ▶ Sign at Station 4, St. Andrews West \$35,000
- Wages and Training
- Community Risk Assessment \$50,000 (2021) and Update to Fire Master Plan - \$50,000 (to be included in the 2022 Budget)
- Reserves for the new fire hall (Station 2) in Ingleside. -\$150,000
- Slight increase in operation costs for By-law Enforcement







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# **Operations Budget**

#### New Sign at Station 4 in St. Andrews West - \$10,000

- ► The current sign was installed in 2002 and is in poor condition.
- ▶ \$10,000 was included in the 2020 budget, an additional \$25,000 will be required.
- Will display fire department notices such as burn bans and public education information. Shared with the Parks and Recreation Department.
- Budget source: Property Tax Revenue









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# **Operations Budget**

#### Fire Department Wages and Training

- ▶ The Ontario Fire College (OFC) is closing March 31, 2021.
- ► Firefighters will attend Regional Training Centers (RTC) for courses.
- ► The cost ranges from \$500-\$1,200 per course at Regional Training Centers, plus accommodations.
- ► Funds will also be used to get members their Firefighter 1 and 2 Certification as required by National Fire Protection Association (NFPPA).







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# **Operations Budget**

#### **Proposed Group Training Opportunities**

- ► Live Burn Training
- Auto Extrication Training
- Pump Ops Training
- ► Ice/Water Rescue









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# **Operations Budget**

Develop a Community Risk Profile and Review and Update the Township's 2016 Fire Master Plan - \$50,000 (2021)

- Community Risk Profile \$50,000 (2021)
- ► All municipalities must undertake a Community Risk Assessment by July 1, 2024.
  - Assessment to be monitored and reviewed annually
  - ▶ New Community Risk Assessment to be completed every 5 years
- Budget source: Reserves (revenue from MTO Invoicing).







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# **Operations Budget**

Develop Community Risk Profile and Review and Update the Township's 2016 Fire Master Plan - \$50,000 (2021)

- Update Fire Master Plan \$50,000 (to be included in 2022 Budget)
- ► Most of the current Fire Master Plan recommendations have been addressed.
- ► Future growth and development of the Township requires a review and update of this plan.
- ► The RFQ would include both the Community Risk Profile and the Fire Master Plan.







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# Operational Budget

#### Half-Ton Pick-up Truck - \$50,000

- ► Fire Prevention Officer is currently sharing a vehicle with the By-Law Enforcement Officer.
- ► The Township's Fire Prevention Program has evolved to include an increase in home inspections, commercial business inspections, school visits and other public education activities.
- ► The purchase of a new half-ton truck for the Fire Chief would allow the Fire Chief's current 2014 Ford F-150 to be used by the Fire Prevention Officer.
- ► Funded by 2021 Property Tax Revenue







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# Operational Budget

#### New Fire Hall - Station 2

► Add \$150,000 to reserves for the future construction of a new Fire Hall for Station 2 in Ingleside.









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# **Proposed Capital Projects**

- ➤ Trailer for the snowmobile at Station 1 in Long Sault. \$10,000
- ▶ Purchase of Pumper Tanker for Station 2. \$600,000
- Begin procurement process for Pumper Tanker for Station
  3
  - Estimated at\$650,000 \$700,000

2020 Snowmobile Donation

#### Trailer for the Snowmobile - \$10,000

- ► In 2020, SSFR received the donation of a snowmobile and rescue basket from the Constance Bay Firefighters Association.
- ► The snowmobile is currently kept at Station 1 because of the proximity to the Long Sault Parkway.
- A trailer is necessary to transport the snowmobile for training.











# **Proposed Capital Projects**

#### **Identified Issues of Current Fleet Inventory**

- ► Tanker at Station 4 (2002) must be replaced within the next 24 months due to age, rust and corrosion.
- ➤ Pump at Station 3 is over 25 years old. If Pump is not replaced, the Department will not achieve the Accredited Superior Tanker Shuttle Service.
- New pump for Station 2 is scheduled to be delivered Spring 2021.

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# **Proposed Capital Projects**

#### **Proposed Fleet Changes**

- Remove 1997 Pumper from Station 2 out of service upon delivery of the 2020 Pumper.
- ▶ Remove 1996 Pumper from Station 3 out of service.
- ▶ Begin procurement process for a new Pumper Tanker for Station 3 to replace the current Pumper. Anticipated delivery of Fall 2022. Cost: \$650,000 \$700,000
- Move the 2011 Tanker from Station 3 to Station 4.
- Remove 2002 Tanker from Station 4 out of service.
